Organization

Board members represent a variety of professions and experience- architecture, River City real estat urban policy and planning, and civic leadership. Several Board members have invested in and restored historic homes in Ludlow.



LUDLOW HISTORIC DISTRICT

The oldest section of Ludlow became an official Historic Overlay District in 2019. The district includes both sides of Elm St. to the river from the railroad overpass to Adela St.



The purpose of this district is to preserve the architectural integrity of the neighborhood and businesses in the city's urban core, Property owners desiring to update and renovate their buildings or who plan in-fill projects have access to the technical expertise of the Urban Design Review Board (URDB) and the city's Historic Preservation Officer. Matching grants are provided for some projects,

Administration

The UDRB oversees the preservation of properties in the District and grants permits for updates and/or changes to a building's frontage. The Board is comprised of five members appointed by the Mayor, and the ex officio city Historic Preservation Officer. Applications for permits are available at the city building.
