GRAND OPENING OF LUDLOW COMMUNITY CENTER

TUESDAY, OCTOBER 29 5-8pm

Everyone is invited to the Halloween themed Grand Opening Celebration of the Ludlow Community Center (LCC) on Tuesday, Oct. 29, from 5-8pm. Changes are in the works at the newly renovated city owned building at **808 Elm St.**, formerly known as the Ludlow Senior Center. Under city management, the Center's mission is to provide the community an environment and opportunities for learning, life enhancement and enjoyment.

LCC continues to provide a space for Seniors to gather for activities and midday meals. In addition, LCC offers programs, activities and events for all ages. A Wellness room has been added, offering Medical Massage and Reiki services. Seminars on Health and Wellness will complement these services. Come, be well!

An art room will be stocked with art supplies that can be used for your art or craft masterpieces! Come create!

The Center is also available for rental as an event venue for your next party or celebration. Property Improvements on the river-front have created one of the best river views in the area which can be experienced from the large rear deck at the LCC.

CITY GOVERNMENT NEWS

Streets Adela St. will be paved and rehabbed with work beginning in March 2020. Plans are also in place to pave Ash St. in 2020.

Code Enforcement The Department had 37 active cases through August, 138 new cases opened (102 of these abated), leaving 73 active open cases. The Code Enforcement Department encourages everyone in the city to contact the office if he or she thinks there is a code issue, and the request/complaint will be investigated.

Police Calls in the city are lower than last year this time.

Fire/EMS As of August, **EMS** had responded to 430 calls with response time between 3-4 minutes. **Fire** had 262 calls for the year with an average dispatch to on-scene time of 4 minutes 49 seconds.

CELEBRATING 200 YEARS OF HISTORY AT ELMWOOD HALL

September 7th was a special day in Ludlow as we celebrated the architectural and historic treasure Elmwood Hall. Joined by guests from the Kentucky Historical Society in Frankfort, along with donors David and Carolyn Starke of the Starke Family Foundation, Ludlow's second historical marker was unveiled in front of this local landmark at 244 Forest Ave. Stop by and read the history of one of the oldest homes in Northern Kentucky.
